After her children were grown, Thelma spent a short period of time working out of Billings, Montana and traveling back and forth. After retirement, Thelma and Jerry spent much of

their time traveling the United States by car. The rest of their time was spent with family, mostly helping to raise and enjoy their seven grandchildren. Many of their trips were to Helena, Montana and Missoula, Montana where they visited their daughters and their families. As the family grew, Thelma continued to spend time with her ten great-grandchildren. Following the death of her husband in 1997, Thelma continued to live in Glendive until June 2006 when she moved to Wibaux, Montana. For a few years after moving to Wibaux, Thelma enjoyed working part time at her son Ed and daughter-in-law, Roberta's convenience store and visiting with people in the community. Thelma loved cowboy country music and sang in the kitchen while she cooked. She enjoyed getting the Sunday paper and was skilled at completing crossword puzzles. Thelma loved to play Bingo with her daughters. She enjoyed playing card games with her grandchildren and dominoes on holidays. She always liked to go for a drive and look at the country side. She loved any opportunity to take her grandchildren and great-grandchildren out for lunch or dinner and planned for this as often as possible. Thelma was proud of each member of her family and always made time to have a special bond with each of them. She loved getting her family together and never let any of her children or grandchildren get away without a hug.
