Beach, North Dakota: Thelma Stull, age 91, of Beach passed away on Friday, April 5, 2013 at the Wibaux County Nursing Home in Wibaux, Montana. Following their marriage, John and Thelma lived south of Sentinel Butte, North Dakota where they farmed for many years. In 1960, they moved to the Peterson Place north of Beach where they continued to farm until their retirement in 1978. After their retirement, John and Thelma moved to Beach and in 2009 they moved to the Golden Valley Manor in Beach where they resided until John's passing. Thelma then relocated to the Wibaux County Nursing Home where she resided until her death. John and Thelma were privileged to have been

married over seventy-one years. Thelma was very active in the community and loved spending time with her family. Thelma loved the Lord and was a good Christian example to everyone she met. She was a fantastic cook and many people enjoyed her fresh baked buns and caramel rolls. She enjoyed traveling, working on crossword puzzles, jigsaw puzzles and spending time in her flower garden. Thelma was a member and held various offices in the Beach Evangelical Church, the Golden Valley County Garden Club and was a twenty-five year member of the 3-H Homemaker's Club She enjoyed being on the bowling team where she bowled a 300 game.
