



Vernon J. Schneider

Vernon J. Schneider, age 93, of Glendive, passed away peacefully at home, surrounded by his loved ones, on Thursday, February 14, 2008. A Vigil Service will be held at 7:00 P.M., Monday, February 18, 2008 at the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at 2:00 P.M., Tuesday, February 19, 2008 at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Glendive with Father Joseph Ponessa officiating. Rite of Committal will be in the Dawson County Cemetery in Glendive. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive is entrusted with arrangements. Vernon was born on August 17, 1914 in Wales, North Dakota, the son of Peter P. and Agnes (Platz) Schneider. He was raised and received his education in Wales. Vernon retired as a machinist from the Burlington Northern Railroad after 41 years of service. Vernon was a member of the Glendive Elks Lodge for over 70 years. He was a past president of the Gate City Coin Club and was a board member of the Glendive Frontier Gateway Museum.
