Victoria M. Servas, age 94, of Sidney, Montana and formerly of Glendive, Montana, passed away on Wednesday, March 12, 2003 at the Sidney Health Center Extended Care in Sidney, Montana. Memorial services will be held at 2:00 P.M., Saturday, March 15, 2003 at the First Congregational-United Church of Christ in Glendive, Montana with Brother Guy Pontoriero officiating. Interment will be in the Dawson County Cemetery in Glendive. Memorial visitation will be held from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.. Friday, March 14, 2003 at the Silvernale-Silha funeral Home. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive is entrusted with arrangements. Victoria was born on May 24, 1908 in Lake City, Minnesota, the daughter of William and Clara (Stegner) Potter. She graduated from high school in Minneapolis, Minnesota with the class of 1925. Victoria then attended Winona State Teachers College and graduated in 1927. After receiving her teacher's certificate she ventured out to Lambert, Montana to teach. She married Julius Lassey on July 14, 1928 in Minneapolis, Minnesota. They returned to Cartwright, North Dakota where they lived on the family farm. They had two children, Charles and Bonnie. While her children were in grade school, Victoria taught school in Van Attin School, Sioux Crossing School, and Pleasant Center School, all in McKenzie County, North Dakota. When her children were in high school, she taught in the Fairview, Montana grade school. Later, Victoria furthered her education by attending Eastern Montana College in Billings, Montana, a college in Bellingham, Washington, and Dickinson State College in Dickinson, North Dakota. Victoria

came to Glendive, Montana in 1952 and taught school there for 26 years. She married Henry "Skinny" Servas on December 26, 1954 in Fairview, Montana. Victoria made her home in Glendive until 2000 when she moved to The Lodge in Sidney. Victoria was a member of the Chapter A P.E.O., The Delta Kappa Gamma Society, Book Club, Friends of the Glendive Library, Women's Club, RSVP, Glendive Senior Citizens, Order of Eastern Star, Frontier Gateway Museum, Arts Unlimited, American Legion Auxiliary and the Glendive Hospital Auxiliary, Mayflower Church Circle and the First Congregational Church. Victoria was preceded in death by her parents; her husband in 1986 and three brothers. Survivors include her son, Charles E. (Sharon) Lassey of Great Falls, Montana, her daughter, Bonnie (Gene) Meldahl of Sidney, Montana; five grandchildren, Michael (Nancy) Meldahl of Butte, Montana, Terry (Synneva) Meldahl of Sidney, John (Vicki) Lassey, Paul (Darcy) Lassey and Jeff Lassey all of Spokane, Washington; and eight great grandchildren.
