Wayne Stanley Kegley, age 71, of Glendive, passed away on Wednesday, July 2, 2003 at his home in Glendive. Funeral services will be 2:00 P.M., Monday, July 7, 2003 at the Evangelical Church of North America in Glendive with Pastor Robert Canen officiating. He coached the V.F.W. Babe Ruth baseball team for 15 years and also coached numerous Babe Ruth All Star Teams. Wayne had a great sense of humor which he inherited from his mother. He was a devoted family man who loved his grandchildren and enjoyed attending their events and activities. Wayne was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion.
